Established in 2013, the inaugural MGMAC was held in Jakarta, Indonesia, with the active involvement of the Governor of Jakarta at that time, Joko Widodo, and created under the auspices of the ASEAN.

Since its establishment, MGMAC has been held annually, rotating among ASEAN capitals, providing a venue for city leaders to address urban challenges, share innovative policies, and build partnerships aimed at sustainable urban development. Through this platform, ASEAN capital cities work harmoniously to promote regional integration, enhance urban resilience, and support the socio-economic development of the ASEAN community.

About United Cities and Local Governments Asia Pacific (UCLG ASPAC)

UCLG ASPAC is the largest regional section of United Cities and Local Governments (UCLG) which connects 240,000 local governments in more than 240 countries. ASPAC UCLG serves as а pivotal knowledge management hub for local government issues in the Asia-Pacific region. AMF/MGMAC 2024 Theme

Following the success of the joint ASEAN Mayors Forum (AMF) and Meeting of Governors/Mayors of ASEAN Capitals (MGMAC) events in Phnom Penh and Jakarta, which emphasised the urgency of addressing connectivity, resilience, and economic recovery as key regional challenges, the upcoming AMF will once again be held in conjunction with MGMAC. The event will focus on five (5) crucial areas and will take place from 18 to 19 September 2024 in Vientiane, Lao PDR.

1 Sustainable and Livable City

Building sustainable and livable cities requires a balanced approach that integrates economic growth, environmental care, social fairness, and cultural richness. The concept of Smart Cities (SCs), aimed at enhancing residents' quality of life while ensuring longterm sustainability, has gained popularity, yet achieving these goals demands ongoing and sufficient funding. Large investments are necessary to develop resilient infrastructure, technology, and programmes, making the securing of long-term financing essential to overcoming financial challenges and accelerating the transition to sustainable urban areas.

Innovative financing options like publicprivate partnerships, green bonds, and impact investments can provide the resources needed to meet sustainability goals. Given the significant role cities play in economic activity and greenhouse gas emissions, creating sustainable urban communities is vital, as livable cities not only reduce environmental harm but also promote fairness, cultural life. and connectivity within the ASEAN region. As cities globally adopt the SC concept, it is crucial to focus on financial planning and resource allocation to successfully implement these ambitious plans.

2 Green Tourism

The ASEAN Tourism Forum 2024, themed "Quality and Responsible Tourism Sustaining ASEAN Future," emphasises the significance of green tourism, which aims to develop, promote, and manage tourism sustainably by focusing on environmentally conscious activities that connect regional and global efforts. Green tourism is key to development, sustainable minimisina environmental and community impacts while fostering inclusive growth through strategies such as creating green tourism sites, promoting agricultural and water-based tourism, enhancing cultural experiences, renewable utilising energy, and strengthening community-based tourism.

Additionally, it involves conserving natural resources, heritage, and culture, advocating responsible tourism practices, reducing waste, and encouraging community participation. With 2024 designated as "Visit Laos Year," there is a valuable opportunity to enhance collaboration between the business sector and local communities and share key insights in tourism development.

Sustainable Economic Development

In the current landscape of global and regional connectivity, particularly with the economic growth in South-East Asia, there is a pressing need for a sustainable economic development strategy. This strategy must integrate social progress and environmental protection simultaneously. Building a strong economy goes beyond just improving the nation's production capabilities and income.

It also involves preserving the environment, establishing robust institutions, creating a favourable climate for investment and development, improving infrastructure. supporting the population, managing income and expenditure, and addressing social challenges and poverty. Additionally, it requires cooperation shared and opportunities among countries to be truly effective.



Environmentally Sustainable City

ASEAN Member States are leading the charge in building environmentally sustainable cities that prioritise greenery, cleanliness, and charm, aligning ecosystems with the well-being of residents. Achieving this requires enhancing urban planning, upgrading infrastructure, preserving forests, and increasing public green spaces. Key initiatives include adopting renewable energy sources like wind and solar to powerurban infrastructure, reducing carbon emissions, and improving urban services. To address flood risks, cities should introduce stormwater storage, rainwater collection, and effective water management systems. Ensuring social inclusion through affordable housing, equal access to public services, and active community participation, along with encouraging eco-friendly practices and boosting environmental awareness, are essential for meeting these objectives.



Climate Resilience

Climate significant change poses а challenge to global socio-economic development, including within ASEAN cities, and is crucial to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals. Its effects, such as extreme weather events and rising sea levels, threaten regional security, public wellbeing, and critical infrastructure. The ASEAN Joint Declaration on Climate Change at UNFCCC COP₂₆ underscores the commitment of member states to the Paris Agreement, focusing on building capacity to prevent, mitigate, and

manage climate-related disasters. Key areas include developing clean industries, aligning infrastructure and urbanisation with sustainable planning, managing the energy sector effectively, enhancing transportation halting deforestation. systems. and managing waste efficiently. By prioritising biodiversity conservation, promoting sustainable forestry, and transitioning to clean energy, cities can strengthen climate resilience and create a safe, sustainable environment for their residents.

Objectives



The AMF Summit 2024 and MGMAC 2024 aims to:



Promote Collaboration

Foster consultation and cooperation among local governments, the private sector, international organisations, and academics to strengthen the ASEAN socio-economic system. Sharing lessons will clarify policies, recommend investments, and inspire effective responses to challenges.



Build Resilience

Enhance city and local governments resilience against economic slowdowns, natural disasters, epidemics, rapid urbanisation, and climate change. Cities will share successful strategies for addressing and solving these issues.



Improve Connectivity

Explore ways to enhance connectivity through transportation, telecommunications networks, and digital technology. This aims to facilitate economic growth, social development, and access to services.



Strengthen Alliances

Form alliances and partnerships to tackle common challenges, including securing funds and resources for specific programmes/projects.



Encourage Joint Efforts

Promote concerted efforts to build more connected and sustainable communities. By uniting beneficiaries from various sectors and encouraging joint action, the AMF and MGMAC aim to create positive change and advance shared objectives.

Expected Results



The participants share their knowledge and experiences in order to apply the lessons learned to the real circumstances of each city in the region.

Encourage more cooperation amongst participants from different organisations and sectors in order to form alliances, networks, and partnerships with the shared objective of enhancing sustainability and connectivity.

Develop a roadmap or implementation plan that outlines the procedures, programmes, and projects that will be carried out in the target area or region to improve sustainability and connectivity.

Increase understanding of and support for the significance of sustainability and connectivity as essential elements of sustainable development. involves interaction with policymakers, thought leaders, and the general public as well as public relations and communication initiatives.



Vientiane Declaration, to be issued by the Governors/Mayors of ASEAN Capitals/Cities attending the meeting, which outlines the tasks that should be coordinated and carried out in order to achieve the best outcomes.

Strengthen the network by building partnerships, alliances, and collaborations with the shared goal of ensuring connectivity and resilience in the ASEAN region for participants of the ASEAN Mayors Forum.

The Policy and Guidance Development Statement for the ASEAN Mayors Forum (AMF), will focus on sharing crucial information and best practices. Local governments' perspectives on ASEAN Community Post-2025 will also be discussed.

Possibilities for knowledge transfer and capacity building, such as training and knowledgebuilding exercises, with a focus on members addressing the difficulties in establishing efficient and long-lasting connectivity.

Shuttle Transportation

The shuttle transportation to and from the Hotel to NCC will be **available at Muong Thanh Hotel** with a schedule option.



Holders of Diplomatic/Official/Ordinary Passports from **ASEAN Member States** are eligible for **visa-free entry** into Lao PDR. For the participants of **non-ASEAN countries**, it is advisable to provide the **AMF invitation for visa processing** if necessary.



Local time in Vientiane is GMT +7.



The average temperature range in Vientiane during September is approximately 24°C to 31°C. There are regular but brief periods of **rainfall** expected during this month. These showers can occur **multiple times throughout the day or week**. It's essential to stay flexible and prepared for the intermittent wet weather, especially if you have outdoor activities or travel plans.

Electricity/ Voltage

Lao PDR's voltage is **240 AC**, **50 Hertz**. In Lao PDR, there are various types of power sockets, including Types **A**, **B**, **C**, **E**, and **F**. It is suggested to bring a universal adapter.



Currency

The official currency of Lao PDR is the **Lao Kip (LAK)** with the currency code LAK. Banknote denominations include **500**, **1000**, **2000**, **5000**, **10**,000, **20**,000, **50**,000, and **100**,000 LAK (with the last three zeroes omitted for convenience). No coins are in circulation in Laos anymore.

Card Payments

You can seldom use your foreign card to pay in Laos. Card payments are accepted at high-end international hotels and some souvenir shops in cities like Vientiane and Luang Prabang. Expect a **2-3% card payment fee. Everywhere else, you'll need cash**.



ATMs are available in Vientiane. The most common ATM is from **BCEL** (*Banque pour le Commerce Extérieur Lao*) and accepts **VISA cards**. Mastercards are **mostly accepted**, but **some ATMs may reject them**. **American Express is almost universally not accepted**. The maximum withdrawal amount varies between 1 and 3 million LAK.






