

Access to piped water services in the GAMA and level of those services






Regressive pricing of water versus level of services. Who benefit from subsidies?

Proposed Sanitation and Water Project for the GAMA

Key Project Development Objective (PDO)

 Increase access to safe water and improved sanitation to low income people in the GAMA

Challenges to achieve PDO

- What type of water access? Standpipe, yard-tap, household connection?
- No nearby water main to tap to either inexistent or unreliable
- Lack of toilet facilities & hard to provide them (land, cost, culture..)
- No (or inadequate) facilities to properly treat/dispose wastewater and/or septic sludge
- Lack of institutional capacity to plan, implement and manage, especially sanitation
- Lack of or inadequate pro-poor culture and policies

How Cities Alliance and Partners could help overcome some of the challenges?

- Facilitate/support extensive consultation w/ low income communities to:
 - Understand basic service needs and community characteristics
 - Select most appropriate type(s) of basic services to meet above
 - Involve community in design and implementation to promote ownership
 - Involve community in management/oversight to promote sustainability
- Facilitate dialogue for necessary policy changes to:
 - Develop a better tariff and subsidy strategy that help the real poor
 - Promote integrated approach to planning, implementation and management of basic services in metropolitan areas, such as GAMA, and the necessary institutional restructuring
 - Improve oversight of services and enforce compliance w/ performance



Why should we work in the greater Accra or in Ghana? Opportunities

- Political Will to improve water and sanitation in Ghana in general and in Accra in particular
- Availability of public funds (or at least commitment...), especially for sanitation
- A number of good solutions have been successfully tested by some of CA Partners and can now be scaled-up
- Possibility of financing TA and investments with support from Development
 Partners that are interested in Ghana and act in a coordinated manner
- Strong community organization culture that can be educated to be part of the solution and have a bigger role in social accountability
- Availability of a good number of capable Civil Society Organizations involved in the sector
