I. URBAN BACKUP

WHAT IS URBAN BACKUP?

- CA instrument to support pro-poor urban development
- Initiated by CA and the German Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ)
- Currently financed by BMZ
- No bilateral development cooperation project but an initiative to flank existing CA / CA-members programs



OVERALL OBJECTIVE:

Develop capacities of Local Authorities to adequately manage pro-poor urban development processes

in order to

improve living conditions of the urban poor in Ghana.



CAPACITY GAPS IDENTIFIED BY PARTICIPANTS / INTERVENTION AREAS:

- Strategic leadership, long-term and participatory planning and networking
- Managerial and technical planning and implementation skills,
 e.g. spatial planning, land management, M&E
- Follow-up financing for urban development projects









POTENTIAL PRODUCTS:

- Pro-poor Urban Vision & Strategy (CDS, SU-Strategy)
- Platform for dialogue with communities, e.g. Municipal Forum
- Peer Learning Networks
- Local South-South-Cooperation
- SU-, settlement-, land-use strategy
- Revenue enhancement

POTENTIAL IMPACTS:
