# Optional Habitat for Humanity "Build Louder Trip" to Kumasi, Ghana (tbc)

**Venue:** Nkwantakese (in the Afigya Sekyere District in the Ashanti Region of Ghana). It is situated to the south west of Agona Ashanti the District Capital.

Habitat for Humanity Ghana, an affiliate programme to Habitat for Humanity International, believes it is possible to eradicate sub-standard or poverty housing in Ghana: with the support of everyone of course! The impelling conviction is that no development strategy or programme can succeed in the absence of attention to housing. Productivity, the hallmark of economic and social progress will remain a mirage if families are not adequately housed. Our goal therefore is to eliminate poverty housing in Ghana.

Habitat's goal is eliminate poverty housing and homelessness from the face of the earth by constructing and building adequate and basic housing. Furthermore, all of our words and actions are for the ultimate purpose of putting shelter on the hearts and minds of people in such a powerful way that poverty housing and homelessness become socially, politically, and religiously unacceptable in our nation and world

Habitat for Humanity Global Village trips to Ghana give participants a unique opportunity to become active partners with warm and friendly Ghanaians to build homes, communities, love and hope. Team members work alongside members of the host community, raising awareness of the burden of poverty housing and building decent, affordable houses. Participants experience a unique working trip that also gives them the opportunity to learn about the host community's culture, language and social practices as well as developing new skills and confidence.

Most days are spent working side-by-side with future homeowners and local volunteers. Itineraries are balanced with work, rest, cultural activities and free times. Most teams also spend a couple of days (depending on the length of their trip) visiting local historic sites and participating in recreational activities.

Habitat for Humanity Ghana has over the years hosted many Global Village teams, some numbering as many as 44 from countries as the Netherlands, The United States, Canada and Northern Ireland, etc.
